The Cause of Fatima Children Progresses:

The visit of the International Pilgrim Statue of Our Lady of Fatima, to the Parish last Wednesday, proved to be very inspiring for all those who attended. We were privileged to be one of the few locations in the Cork area to be chosen for the visit. We were reminded again that we have a great Mother in Heaven. We were reminded of the importance of the Rosary, the Brown Scapular and of our need to make reparation for sin. While the Statue image of Our Lady of Fatima was beautifully decorated, as Catholics we do <u>not</u> worship the Statue or indeed Our Lady Herself. We believe that she was given to us by Christ Jesus as He died on the Cross, to be our Mother, as in His dying words He entrusted Her as Mother to St. John. We believe that Almighty God entrusted Her to be Mother of us all, when He assumed Her into Heaven body and soul, at Her death. Our Lady is not a Statue, but a living person in Heaven, who is guiding and protecting all humanity on earth, under the direction of God Himself.

Our Lady appeared six times a hundred years ago in Fatima, Portugal to three small children: Lucia, Francesco & Jacinta, it was on May 13th to October 13th, 1917. Pope Francis is going to Fatima for the coming Centenary celebration on May 12th & 13th. Two of the children. Francesco and Jacinta were beatified in the year 2000, when also the famous 3rd secret of Fatima was revealed by the Vatican. Recently on March 23rd, the required miracle for the children's canonisation was approved by Pope Francis. Francesco died on April 4th, 1919 aged 10. Jacinta died on February, 20th, 1920 aged nine. Felipe Moura Margues was born with incurable Type 1 diabetes. His mother and grandmother were fervent devotees of Francesco and Jacinta and brought the child to their tombs. On May 13th, 2000, while watching on television the beatification of the children, the mother prayed for their intercession for the healing of her sick child and the child was completely cured. With the Church's approval of the miracle. it is now speculated that Pope Francis may Canonise the children, when he goes to Fatima on May 13th. If this happens, they will be the youngest non martyred Saints in the history of the Catholic Church. May Our Lady of Fatima and the Blessed Children pray for us all.
