Mass for Exam Students: You are all invited to a Special Mass, both parishioners and students, their families and friends, for all our exam students on Monday evening next, June 5<sup>th</sup> at 7.30pm in the Parish Church. The Mass is being organised by the Parish Pastoral Council, in order to pray and support all exam students in our locality. We pray for all our young people involved in exams this year, including third level students, who have completed their exams. Our young people are very important to us and we want them to know that we understand the strains and challenges that face them. While we ask the Holy Spirit to guide them to success in their exams, we also pray for their happiness and protection in all their decisions and undertakings. So, you are all invited to come along to the Mass and to actively support and pray for God's Blessing on our young people at this important time in their lives.

The Duquesne Students and the Holy Spirit: On this Pentecost Sunday our focus is on the coming and renewal of the Holy Spirit. The 20<sup>th</sup> Century marked a revival of devotion to the Holy Spirit in the various Christian Communities. Duquesne is a Catholic University in Pittsburgh, America. In 1966 and 1967 some Professors at the College were filled with a desire to receive a "Baptism in Holy Spirit" i.e. a renewal of the power of the Holy Spirit in their lives. On the weekend of 17<sup>th</sup>-19<sup>th</sup> February 1967about 20 students from the University went on a retreat. During the retreat the students were touched by the Holy Spirit in a special way. This is how one of them, Patti Gallagher Mansfield describes what happened: "Saturday night we were to have a birthday party, but one by one we were drawn into the Chapel and received what is called the Baptism in the Holy Spirit. It happened to different people in different ways. I became struck by a deep awareness that God is real and that He loves us. Prayers poured forth from my lips that I would have never had the courage to say aloud before. The gifts of the Holy Spirit are manifest now, I can testify to this, because I have heard people pray in tongues, heal, discern spirits, speak with extraordinary wisdom and faith, prophesy and interpret. I now realise that there is nothing we have to bear ourselves, no prayer that God doesn't answer, no need that the Lord is not rich enough to fill! And I feel such tremendous freedom in depending on Him, in truly praising God. We can try to live as Christians and to die to ourselves and sin, but without the power of the Spirit, it can be a rather discouraging struggle. There are still temptations and problems, but now I have the confidence and trust in God, now I have the strength from the Lord to really change and love with Him. It's true we receive the Holy Spirit at Baptism and Confirmation and then we are His temples, but we do not open enough to His gifts and His power in our lives. It's true that the Spirit is a teacher, because I have learned so much in such a short time from Him! Scripture lives! I'm sure that I could never come by so much knowledge alone. despite good intentions and efforts". It was the Duquesne weekend student's retreat that began the Catholic Charismatic Renewal fifty years ago this year. To mark the event, Pope Francis has invited all the Charismatic prayer groups to Rome this Pentecost Sunday to pray together with the Pope.- continued over the page  $\rightarrow$
