The Wonder of Conception: Medical science has made incredible advances in recent years, but those advances have also brought great challenges. Pregnancy tests and scans can now show us the wonder of a newly conceived baby after a very few weeks. But those same tests can also tell us a great deal about the well-being of the unborn baby. One of those tests can reveal what is now popularly called fatal foetal abnormality. This diagnosis may reveal that the baby's condition could cause death before birth or shortly after. This news is very traumatic for any parents and most especially the mother. The last item on the R.T.E. Late Late Show on Friday, February 26th had an interview with a voung couple who found themselves in this difficult situation. They said they were faced with two options: terminate the pregnancy or let the pregnancy take its natural course. They decided to cherish every moment of the life of their unborn baby. The mother gave birth and their baby lived for three hours. It was very touching to hear the couple's account of their love for their child, despite the very difficult circumstances and the short times they had with their child. The interview would encourage any couple who may find themselves in that situation of the healing value of cherishing life, even though it may be only for a short while. The couple were not Catholics because they said they had a humanist ceremony for their baby.

The Irish Constitution in the 1983, 8th Amendment protects the equal right to life of mother and child and supports the life of both. All life is precious, human society has a duty to protect it, even in very difficult circumstances. A society that supports parents in cherishing life is a good society.

Prayer for the Child in the Womb

Lord Jesus, you are the source and lover of life. Reawaken in us respect for every human life. Help us to see in each child the marvellous work of our Creator. Open our hearts to welcome every child as a unique and wonderful gift. Guide the work of doctors, nurses and midwives. Help those who make our laws to uphold the uniqueness and sacredness of every human life, from the first moment of conception to natural death. Give us wisdom and generosity to build a society that cares for all. Together with Mary, your Mother, in whose womb you took on our human nature, Help us to choose life in every decision we take.

We ask this in the joyful hope of eternal life with you, and in the communion of the Blessed Trinity. Amen.
