We have five family fun days in the year, this gives parents a chance to enjoy a day out, as we all have children with special needs. As a lot of them find it hard to deal with new situations, if a child is having a bad day there is helpers at hand and no one watching as we are all in the same boat.

We have begun Sensory Parties which are a fun way to help children with touch and smell issues, for some children sand, flour and sticky items are there worst nightmare. Our most recent party was at the pizza house. And for the first time this year we had an outing for our older siblings, who we often forget are careers too.

We provided helpers for the children to attend mainstream Summer camps. They attended arts and crafts camps, let's go, computer camps and your U 5's attended various pre-school summer camps

Special Friends have monthly meetings as a support network for families. These are at 8pm on the last Tuesday of every mouth.
