St. Teresa of Calcutta: On Monday last, September 5th, the 19th Anniversary of the death of Mother Teresa of Calcutta, Bishop Crean celebrated a Mass of thanksgiving in Blarney Parish Church to mark Mother's Canonisation the previous day. Mother Teresa visited Blarney in June 1996, the year before she died. Her Sisters came to Blarney in 1994, at the invitation of Bishop John Magee. A great crowd attended the Mass, and the Sisters led the participation, including some beautiful singing. A number of Priests concelebrated the Mass and the Bishop was assisted by Rev. John Magner, a Deacon of our Diocese, who is hoping to be ordained to the priesthood for the Diocese next year. John is a native of Whitechurch and the Parish of Blarney. The Sisters invited everyone to the Convent afterwards for some refreshments. The Sisters have fifteen men, of all ages, in rehabilitation, resident in the Convent at present. Our Diocese is truly blessed to have the Missionaries of Charity among us to serve the needs of those seeking healing and shelter.

St. Teresa of Calcutta and the Unborn: At present it seems that a number of branches of our media are strongly campaigning to repeal the 8th Amendment. The 8th Amendment to our Constitution guarantees the equal rights to life of the mother and the unborn child. If the Irish people and they alone have the power to do it by majority vote in a referendum, repeal the 8th Amendment, they will remove the protection of life, now enjoyed by these silent souls and their mothers. St. Teresa of Calcutta, during her life on earth, was a staunch defender of these souls and was not afraid to speak out boldly on their behalf. She was once invited to the White House in America by President and Mrs. Bill Clinton. In conversation, First Lady Hillary Clinton asked Mother Teresa: "Why do you think we haven't had a woman President yet?" The little woman sitting at table with Mrs. Clinton did not hesitate in her reply. "Because she has probably been aborted," said Mother Teresa.

On January 22nd, 1994, St. Teresa was invited to speak at the National Prayer Breakfast in America and she spoke of the cultural corruption that arises out of crimes against the unborn. These are the courageous words of St. Teresa:

"I feel that the greatest destroyer of peace today is abortion, because it is a war against the child, a direct killing of the innocent child, murder by the mother herself. And if we accept that a mother can kill even her own child, how can we tell other people not to kill one another? How do we persuade a woman not to have an abortion? As always, we must persuade her with love and we remind ourselves that love means to be willing to give until it hurts... (Continued over the page)

St. Teresa of Calcutta and the Unborn continued:Any country that accepts abortion is not teaching its people to love, but to use any violence to get what they want. This is why the greatest destroyer of love and peace is abortion. Abortion, she said, is a rejection of the teachings of Christ himself who taught that those who receive a little child, receive him. Mother Teresa concluded that every abortion, as a refusal to receive a little child, is a refusal to receive Jesus. After these words, she paused, receiving a standing ovation.

Mother Teresa went on courageously. I will tell you something beautiful. We are fighting abortion by adoption—by care of the mother and adoption for her baby... Please don't kill the child. I want the child. Please give me the child. I am willing to accept any child who would be aborted and to give that child to a married couple who will love the child and be loved by the child. From our children's home in Calcutta alone, we have saved over 3,000 children from abortion. These children have brought such love and joy to their adopting parents and have grown up so full of love and joy."

For any mother a crisis pregnancy can be a frightening ordeal, but we must never forget a child is always a blessing, no matter what the circumstances or how long the child may live. Like St. Teresa, it is necessary to support all mothers and their unborn and protect them both. May St. Teresa of Calcutta intercede for the Irish people and its future generations at this critical time.
