"Other Spiritualties and Christian Faith" During the middle ages, just like now, the Christian Faith declined, but fortune tellers and other such pagan practices increased. Recently, Pope Francis strongly criticised the practice of going to Tarot Card Readers or other fortune tellers. It is contrary to Christian hope, a form of idol worship, he said, its worship of a god that can do nothing, is a liar, and so it is contrary to the First Commandment. In recent years a number of Catholics have been drawn away from Christ and His Grace in the Eucharist. But in their hunger and confusion, they have been drawn into Eastern therapies, spiritualties and old ancient pagan practices. He promises the fullness of life and everlasting reward. The substitutes can only mean the loss of true peace and everlasting salvation. We encourage you all to be alert to the deceitful forces that are at work to draw us away from Jesus, the true source of Eternal Life.
