Mitchelstown has been chosen to host the finish of stage number 5 in this year's An Post Rás. The visit of the Rás to Mitchelstown will be highly beneficial to our local economy, while also raising the national and international profile of our town. It will provide a thrilling spectacle and most importantly of all, it will attract young and old to the sport of cycle racing. Over 200 Cyclists will take part and we expect that hundreds of their supporters and families will converge on the town.

On Thursday the 23rd of May 2013, the cyclists will arrive in Mitchelstown between the hours of 2pm-3pm. Traffic diversions will be in place from 2pm. Disruption will be kept to a minimum as these will only be in place while the Cyclists are coming through the town to the finish line just below the Post Office.

At 11.00am on the 23rd of May the Rás Organisers will be erecting barriers on Upper Cork Street. Parking restrictions will apply. Please be mindful of this if you own a vehicle.

On Friday the 24th of May at 11.00am the race will recommence traffic control measures will be in place while the Cyclists move off, these will be kept to a minimum. (Maximum time frame of twenty minutes)
