October 13th 1917: Almost one hundred years ago the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to thr children in Fatima, Portugal. They were Lucia, aged 9, Francesco, aged 7 and Jacinta, aged Our Lady appeared six times to them on the 13th of each month, between May and Octob 1917. Many disbelieved the children and made fun of them, so they asked their vision perform a miracle, so that people would believe that what they told was true. In the Ju apparition Our Lady told the children, that in October she would perform a miracle, so that a would believe. In the July apparition, Our Lady showed the children a vision of Hell and sh told them that many souls go there, because there was nobody to pray or make sacrifice f them. It was then, that she gave them the prayer that we say between the decades of the Rosar "O Jesus forgive us for our sins, save us from the fires of Hell and lead all souls to Heave especially those in most need of your mercy". This was the principal message of Our Lady Fatima: her sorrow for the souls who would go to Hell forever. She then revealed, that Go wished to establish devotion to Her Immaculate Heart in the world and by this means man souls would be saved.

In 1917 the First World War was raging and Our Lady requested during all six apparitions the daily recitation of the Rosary. She predicted that the war would soon end (which it did in the fall of 1918). But, she also said, if mankind didn't cease to offend God, a greater war wou come. She specifically requested the Consecration of Russia to her Immaculate Heart, becau she said, Russia would spread her errors throughout the world (Communism, a world witho God) promoting wars and persecution of the church. She requested the first five Saturdays Ho Communion of reparation, in order to prevent this. She warned of the dangers of Nations bein annihilated, if what she requested was not done.

In the October apparition, she revealed herself as the Lady of the Rosary and she pleaded wi mankind to stop offending God. Even though up to this point there had been torrential rain a that morning, the clouds parted and the sun appeared spinning in the sky and emitting a host beautiful colours. Then the sun seemed to leave its position in the sky and come toward the 70,000 crowd watching, everyone cried out for mercy and the sun retreated to its norm position once again. This is known as the miracle of the sun at Fatima and the vast crowd, mo especially the unbelievers, went home repentant. In these dark days, let us re-study the events Fatima and live the message that Our Lady gave almost a 100 years ago.
