### "Come to me ....."

On Friday next, June 19<sup>th</sup>, the Church celebrates the feast of the "Sacred Heart of Jesus". This feast originated with a French nun Sr. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647 – 1690). She had four great visions, in which Christ revealed His Sacred Heart to her. Beginning in December on the feast of St. John the Evangelist, in 1673. Flames were rising from the Heart of Jesus, it was crowned with thorns and it was bleeding. He said: "My Divine **Heart** is so inflamed with love for mankind, and for you in particular, that being unable any longer to contain within itself the flames of its burning charity, it must spread them abroad through you". In the second vision, Sr. Margaret said: "Jesus assured me that we must honour the Heart of God under the figure of this heart of flesh". The third vision was on a 1<sup>st</sup> Friday (month unspecified) Christ especially directed her to receive Holy Communion on the 1<sup>st</sup> Friday of each month. The fourth and greatest vision, took place within the octave of Corpus Christi in the year 1676. Before the Blessed Sacrament exposed on the altar. Sr. Margaret heard these tremendous words: "Behold this Heart which has so loved mankind that it has spared nothing, even to exhausting and consuming itself in order to prove its love to them". Then Christ asked her that the Friday after the octave of Corpus Christi should be set apart for a special feast to honour His Heart, Communion was to be received on that day and reparation made by a solemn act.

A number of promises were also given to Sr. Margaret to all those who venerate and honour the Sacred Heart of Jesus and especially through displaying the picture of the Sacred Heart in the home – that there would be great Blessing for the family.

Sacred Heart of Jesus I place all my trust in you.

## **Year for Priests:**

The Church's 'Year for Priests' is due to commence later this month on June 19<sup>th</sup>. As patron for the year, Pope Benedict has chosen St John Vianney, the Cure of Ars famed for his passionate preaching.

During this year, a directory for confessors & spiritual directors will be published, along with a compilation of texts by the Pope on the core issues of the life & mission of priests in the modern times.

According to a Vatican communiqué, a key goal will be to address "the need to intensify the permanent formation of priests". The year should provide a welcome opportunity for the entire Church, priests and people, to reflect on the role of priesthood and responsibility we all share for promoting & fostering the unique vocation of the priest.

## **Confirmation Boys & Girls & the Pledge:**

For many years when boys & girls were confirmed, on the same day they took a pledge to abstain from alcohol until they were 18 years of age. Then it was decided to give boys & girls a chance to think about taking the pledge before they made their decision. By taking it automatically on Confirmation day this could put pressure on the boys & girls, it was also felt they might be less likely to keep it. So now we invite the boys & girls to become young pioneers & to take the pledge to abstain from alcohol until they are 16 years of age. This year the pledge will be given at the Saturday Evening Mass June 20<sup>th</sup> at 7.30 p.m. Because of the dangers of alcohol, we strongly encourage the boys & girls to take the pledge until they are 16 years. They can then decide to extend their pledge or become full members of the Pioneer Association, if they so wish. Respect & temperate use of alcohol is so important in our society today. It is important that we encourage & support the boys & girls in their decision. The Youth 2000 Group will lead the singing at the Mass, instead of the Sunday evening Mass June 21st.
