The Abortion Debate: Legislation to allow abortion in certain limited cases has been passed by the Dáil. For a number of T.D.'s this proposal has caused much agony and even the loss of their senior political positions. What will be the effect of this legislation? Will it make women's life safer? Will it affect the safety of the unborn? Will it open the floodgates to abortion on demand? Will it make abortion more acceptable in our country? What affect will it have on our medical profession and the nursing profession? Many questions remain and only time will answer them. We all accept that for many women and men pregnancy is a great joy, but we also know for number of women and men, particularly women, pregnancy can be a great crisis. Do we do enough to help parents and women in particular, in a crisis pregnancy? Many women and parents who find themselves in this situation are tempted to act in haste a deeply regret going for an abortion later. For all of us who cherish human life, regardless of this legislation, we must continue to support and encourage those in cris pregnancy to reflect calmly and to seek help from Cura and other caring agencies.
