Lessons to be learned: The Bible begins with the story of Adam & Eve. Their daughter happened because they disobeyed, they were in perfect harmony in the Garden of Eden, but they were warned under pain of death, not to eat the fruit of the tree in the middle of the garden. But they were tempted and they ate and they suffered the consequences. The lesson is, that it is foolish for us not to heed the warnings. Twelve Thai soccer players and their assistant coach were successfully rescued this week. There is a warning sign at the Cave's entrance of the dangers during the monsoon rains, which flood the famous cave from time to time. That day the head coach had an appointment and he asked the 25 year old assistant coach to take care of the boys. Eke was a very generous young man and the boys loved him, but that day in the end of June, they ignored the warnings and went on an adventure into the dangerous cave. The rains came and flooded the cave chambers, leaving the boys and their coach to take refuge on a cave ledge. It was a miracle they survived, with one light and little food for nine days. It was a miracle that they were all safely rescued this week. But it must be remembered, that a 38 year old retired Thai navy seal lost his life while bringing the boys bottles of oxygen. That young many gave his life to rescue those boys. The lesson to be learned is for all of us to take "warning signs" seriously. They are there for a reason. We live in a wonderful world, but there are dangers to be alert to. The Way of the Gospel is not always easy, it demands self-denial and discipline, but it protects us from foolishness. As St. Paul reminds us, "the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life" We rejoice in the recovery of the Thai soccer players, but there are many lessons to be learned.

The World Cup: The World Cup Tournament is coming to an end and some of you will be saying, "Thanks be to God!" We also thank God for the gift of sport, the players, the skills, the management, it is a wonder to watch and appreciate. The prize is the honour and acclaim of one's country and, of course, the magnificent trophy and a place in the history books. All these things drive people on to achieve at the highest level. God too must enjoy watching his children organising it all. God is often forgotten by his children, but during these matches, many eyes and hearts raised to God, in the most intense moments. It was a great tournament and well done to them all. Thanks for the joy and excitement that all sports players brings us. In a world that is so often ruthless, sport is a welcome relief.
