V. REV. CANON PATRICK SHEEHAN, PE

V. Rev. Canon Patrick Sheehan former Parish Priest of Mitchelstown parish and Vicar Forane of Fermoy Deanery, died Friday 7th August at the age of ninety two.

A native of Blarney, Canon Sheehan studied for the priesthood at St. Patrick's College, Maynooth, and was ordained in 1942. After his ordination he was appointed Hospital Chaplain in Youghal. He then held curacies in Coachford, Buttevant, Fermoy and Carrigtwohill. He later served as Parish Priest of Kilnamartyra and Mitchelstown, and retired in 1994. He became a member of the Cathedral Chapter of Canons in 1984. Canon Sheehan died in Marymount Hospice, Cork on 7th August 2009. He was laid to rest on Monday last after 2 p.m. concelebrated Mass in St. Patrick's Church. Whitechurch.

Canon Pat is fondly remembered here in Mitchelstown for his faithful service as Parish Priest. Let us remember him in our Prayers. We also extend our sympathy to his relatives and friends and to his devoted housekeeper, of 39 years, Kathleen.

Some Facts Regarding the Eucharistic Congress

- The First International Eucharistic Congress was held in Lille (France) in 1881.
- Up to the 1920s the Eucharistic Congresses focussed primarily on the Eucharist itself (liturgy, adoration, real presence, frequent communion etc.)
- From the 1920's on there was a change of emphasis. While the Sacrament of the Eucharist and the Sacrifice of the Mass remained central to the Congress, there was also a growing emphasis on what it meant to be a Eucharistic people in the particular context of place and time.
- The theme of the 1932 Dublin Congress was: *The Eucharist and Ireland More to follow Next Week!*
