Pope Sends Envoy to Medjugorje: Six young people have claimed daily apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary since June 24th, 1981 in Medjugorje (Bosnia and Herzegovina), three of them to this day, the other three at specific days throughout the year. There are four girls: Ivanka, Mirjana, Vicka, and Marija and two boys Ivan, Jakov. All six visionaries have married and have children. It is now almost 36 years since the apparitions began and the youngest, Jakov is 46, the others are in their 50's. The main message they say the Blessed Virgin gives them is an invitation to open our hearts to God, through Praver and Fasting, for He alone is the true source of peace. The messages ask us to put God first in our lives and go to monthly Confession. The messages assert again and again that the Blessed Virgin has been permitted by God to be with us at this time and she intercedes for each one of us. Over the 35 years of the apparitions, millions of people have been to Medjugorje and re-discovered their faith. The young people asked Our Lady, like previous apparitions, for a sign so that people would believe them. In reply the Vision has promised to unbelievers a visible indestructible sign on the hill of the apparitions, when the apparitions end, but the Vision added not to wait for the sign, because when it comes, it will be too late for many. The Visionaries say Our Lady appeals to us, to convert now.

The local Diocese, the Episcopal Conference of former Yugoslavia and now the Vatican has, as yet, after many commissions of investigation, made no official declaration on the matter. In the past week Pope Francis has appointed a Special Envoy, to acquire a profound understanding of the pastoral situation in Medjugorje, with special concern for the needs of faithful who come on pilgrimage. On the basis of that understanding he is to suggest possible pastoral initiatives for the future. The Envoy is at present the Archbishop of Warsaw, Poland, Henryk Hoser, of the Pallottine Order. The Archbishop will have an exclusively pastoral character and his mission will end next summer.

"What we need to know about Yoga and Mindfulness" Many people today, whether they are aware of it or not, are searching for meaning and purpose in their lives. Many people lament they are afflicted from stress because of the demands and pressures of present day living. We all have heard of reflexology, Reiki, bioenergy, yoga, shamanism, many others and now the popular one is mindfulness. Both yoga and mindfulness have their origins in the Eastern philosophy of Buddhism. Buddhism holds there is no distinction between God and the universe. Through enlightenment a person becomes one with all of existence. There are various shades and colours of yoga, but one classic yoga mantra is "so'ham" meaning "I am the universal self", which is often used repetitively, timed with your breathing. Mindfulness again focuses on the self as a form of meditation and relaxation, to help people with a wide range of physical and mental health problems. It was developed by Jon Kabat-Zinn in 1979 in America. The dangers in all these therapies for Christians are the focus on self as a means of salvation. Have we forgotten that we believe in one God, the Father Almighty, the Creator of Heaven and Earth? Have we forgotten the words of Jesus Christ, the Saviour who died for us "Come to me all who labour and are overburdened and I will give you rest". We believe salvation can only be found in Jesus Christ and not in ourselves. All true meditation is a personal encounter with God and His Son Jesus Christ. As Christians we must be alert to these subtle and misleading false doctrines. The more people are drawn into these "self-centred" doctrines, the more likely they are to decrease their adherence to Christianity and the more likely they are to adhere to nonreligious spirituality and Buddhism. These self-focused practices are a gateway to be spiritually disconnected from Christ. We need to get back to Christian meditation; we need to spend time with Jesus Christ, truly present in the Eucharist. We need to take up again our Rosary beads and meditate on the life, death and resurrection of Our Saviour Jesus Christ. He is the Way, the Truth and the Life. We also need to take up our Bibles and meditate on the word of God. He alone gives rest and peace. The Word of God is our salvation, looking for it in ourselves is a deception.
