Knockadoon Music & Liturgy Course 2009

28 Years of Liturgical Music; We are excited to announce the 28th Knockadoon Music & Liturgy Course which takes place this summer from August 15th – 22nd. Every summer the Knockadoon Folk Liturgy course brings together over 150 young people and adults to learn, celebrate and grow not only as musicians, but as ministers of music.

It all began 28 years ago when the Dominicans in Cork began what has become the longest running course for young people in contemporary liturgical music. The purpose of the course is to help people who are involved in the ministry of liturgical music to learn new music as well as having an opportunity to learn new instruments and participate in the Liturgy of Morning Prayer, Evening Prayer and the Eucharist. Over the past 28 years over 3,500 people have attended the course.

The course is led by a tremendous team of 20 adult leaders and tutors (all volunteers) comprising of musicians, teachers, liturgists, youth ministers and composers, who have many years experience in working in a liturgical setting and bring their own unique skills and talents to the course. As each year passes by, we look to learn from previous years and add to the course material and program. A particular component of our recent courses has been the presence of some contemporary liturgical composers/musicians from the USA. *A Week of Fun;* While the week is about learning new music, there is plenty of free time for the participants to have some fun. Nightly entertainment is provided, while afternoon activities range from swimming to football and we make sure that it will be a week that you will enjoy and participate in fully.

Tutorials; In Knockadoon, we believe that each participant should be given every opportunity to learn new skills and develop existing ones. Therefore during the week we provide tutorials for each participant in their areas of interest. These various tutorials include: Vocal/Cantor, Keyboard, Guitar, Flute, Percussion, Composition, Music Theory, Drama and Liturgical Movement. If you play an instrument, please bring it along with you, if it is practically possible.
