EU Flag:

The EU flag, which as we all know has 12 stars against a blue background, but do we know the origin of its design?

What most of us did not know, however, is that this flag – unknown to those who chose it as the emblem for Europe – was inspired by the Immaculate Conception! The European ministers chose the design in 1955, five years after a competition was launched to find a winning design for the European flag. The winner was Arsne Heitz, a devotee of the Blessed Virgin, who has recently revealed that at the time of the competition he had been reading the story of the 1830 Marian apparitions of St. Catherine Laboure in the rue du Bac in Paris. This is where his inspiration came from to create twelve stars in a circle on a blue background, the image used traditionally to depict the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin. The image is drawn from the 'great and wondrous' sign mentioned in the Book of Revelation, which speaks of "a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet and a crown of twelve stars on her head." Heitz, who prays the Rosary every day, believes that the inspiration for his design was heaven-sent. The European ministers, without realising, adopted the flag in 1955 on, the 8th December – feast of the Immaculate Conception. Every time we see the EU flag hoisted from now on, knowing what it depicts, we can look upon it as a sign of 'sure hope' for our times.

Eucharistic Adoration – 20th Anniversary:
On Monday night June 29th at 7.30 p.m. Fr. Pat Winkle will lead a concelebrated Mass of Thanksgiving for 20 years of perpetual Adoration of the Holy Eucharist in our Parish. The 1st two centres of Perpetual Adoration began in the Diocese of Cloyne on December 8th 1988, and the other eight began in the following sixteen months. The success of Adoration in Mitchelstown Parish is due to the wonderful love and devotion of so many people (a number from outside the Parish) to the Blessed Eucharist: people who come week after week, year after year to spend their hour in prayer, many doing so since the adoration began. We hope for a big attendance at the Anniversary Mass. We also invite all the families of the Parish to consider giving together an hour of Adoration. Time spent in Adoration of Jesus will bring great blessings to all. Fr. Michael.
