#### What is Good Friday?

"It was about the sixth hour and with the sun eclipsed, a darkness came over the whole land until the ninth hour. The veil of the Temple was torn right down the middle; and when Jesus had cried out in a loud voice, He said, "Father into your hands I commit my spirit". "With these words He breathed His last." (Gospel of Luke Chapter 23).

In preparation for the European Soccer Championship in June a friendly international has been organised between Ireland and Switzerland on Good Friday. Going back to 1927 public houses have remained closed on Good Friday. Now they demand to be allowed to open to accommodate football fans and the influx of tourists.

This must challenge us all to reflect on What is Good Friday? Like retaining the Angelus and schools remaining closed on January 6<sup>th</sup>, another Sacred Day for Christians needs to be reflected upon. For your reflection you might find it helpful to Google "What is Good Friday?"

Since the 1<sup>st</sup> Century, Christians regarded every Friday as a special day, because they believed that this was the day that their Saviour suffered and died in the Cross for the release of their sins and the sins of humanity. As the Christian Religion became more established, understood and appreciated, the events of Christ's suffering, death and resurrection came to be more solemnly celebrated. The day Christ died became known as God's Friday, Holy Friday, Good Friday and other terms. Even though what was done to Christ was not good on that day, the benefits for all who accepted Christ were enormous – forgiveness of sins, eternal life.

As a Christian Nation generations of Irish people have given special respect to the Day and the hour Christ died. Up until recent years it was an unwritten understanding that the last thing you would organise on Good Friday would be a soccer international, out of respect for God and for what many of us believe what He has done for us.

Believing Christians must ask themselves: Can I remain silent at this challenge to a most sacred tradition? Will it make any difference to the well being of my nation by treating this Sacred Day, as any other day? Before His death, did not Jesus weep over the city that was about to reject Him?

It is time for our Nation to think very carefully and for believing Christians to stand up and speak up.

Good Friday this year will be celebrated on Friday March 25th: **We adore You, O Christ and we praise You, because by Your Holy Cross You have redeemed the World.** 

*P.S.* Good Friday became a National Holiday in Cuba due to the efforts of Pope Benedict XVI. Pope Benedict requested that President Raul Castro make the Religious date a Public Holiday, this he allowed for many to do.
