The Drug Situation: It gives none of us any joy to see people suffering because they got caught in the delivering of illegal drugs - ecstasy tablets. It gives us all relief and time to reflect on the damage these drugs can do to vulnerable young people in our community. Vulnerable young people are easily drawn to experiment with drugs - try them out - not realising the dangers they may bring with them. Young people can be lonely, bored and with very little sense of self value, the possible excitement of drugs can be very attractive, for someone in this state of mind. The first sample may be offered free, but down the road you will pay. People make a lot of easy money dealing in drugs, but they do so, on the back of weak young people – that is abuse. Drugs are very addictive and those who use them become dependent on them in a very short time. Very soon the debt for them builds up and the strain on an individual and on a family is enormous. This is when dealers and pushers turn nasty. We congratulate the Gardaí on work well done and we encourage them to continue to root out this evil in our community, but they cannot do it alone - family and community life needs to be strengthened and supported. A Youth Café gives healthier options to young people who are bored. Faith in the Lord needs to be encouraged by everybody, for the Lord is the True One who satisfies the emptiness of our hearts and he gives it free.

The Parish will employ a young man in the Autumn, Kevin from NET Ministry to support young people in the Parish. We will also have access to a Youth Worker and a Drugs Worker. The Community needs to work together to confront this evil, before any more of our young people come to tragedy. Thank the Lord for the success of the work of the Gardaí. It is a responsibility on all of us to make our homes and our community a safer place for young people. We appeal to all who are pushing and dealing in drugs to get off the bus and stop preying on the weakness of our young people. If you don't, the punishment that you are facing will be justly deserved.
