## Message to the People of the Diocese of Cloyne:

Dear Friends,

I take this opportunity to highlight the importance of Safeguarding Children in the Diocese of Cloyne. The New Policy Document on Safeguarding and Standards for the Catholic Church in Ireland has come into practice. This Policy is a "One Church Policy" for the Church in Ireland. We all want to have safe places and structures, so that young people and vulnerable adults may be able to participate fully in the life of the Church. A lot of work has been done over the years to put in place proper structure to safeguard children. However, we can never become complacent in this work.

I appreciate the ministry, priests and people give to children, young people and vulnerable adults in the Diocese. It is a continued sign of God's presence. The success of young people traveling to Lourdes and to World Youth Day, as well as all those children who took part in the various Faith Camps in the Diocese during last summer, are reminders that the structures in place for Safeguarding are working. The involvement of children and young people as Altar Servers and as members of choirs, continue to remind us of the importance and necessity of involving children and young people in the Liturgy. We are indebted to all those volunteers in the Diocese, who work to implement the Safeguarding Children Policies and Procedures.

I once again reiterate our commitment to best practice of Safeguarding of children in the Diocese. I continue to work to ensure that the Diocese is here to listen to those who have been abused as children by anyone in Church ministry, and to offer them support. I think of those who have been abused and the hurt they have endured and of those who courageously have come forward to tell their story. I encourage anyone who has been abused by Church personnel to report it.

The whole church in Ireland has set aside Friday, 3<sup>rd</sup> March, the First Friday of Lent, as a time to pray for survivors and victims of abuse. I ask that you remember them in your prayers and Masses on that day.

I ask you to continually pray for the work of Safeguarding Children in the Diocese, that we may continue to reach out to young people and children, that they may hear and know the Joy of the Gospel.

The Safeguarding of Children involves all of us working together to ensure that children grow up with their right to dignity respected.
