# **Cardinal John Henry Newman:**

It's been announced by the Vatican that Cardinal Newman is to be promoted to being a Saint in the Catholic Church in the Autumn. He was born in London in 1801. After a long life he died in Birmingham in 1890. He was brought up in the Anglican faith, but later converted to the Catholic Church, a bit like our own Blessed John O'Sullivan, Cardinal Newman had a number of conversion experiences throughout his life. While initially he enjoyed a privileged lifestyle, he did suffer the failed financial fortunes of his father and after his father's death, became his mother's and families' provider, as he was the eldest of six children. John Henry found a close encounter with Christ at the young age of fifteen, because of the families' financial collapse, being ill and feeling desolate in college. Through these trials, God touched the heart of the fifteen year old in a profound way. Sometime later his father died, then his youngest sister Mary died, age nineteen, with whom he had been very close. But in the midst of these trials he progressed as a teacher and preacher. In his early thirties, he went with friends on a trip to Sicily and decided to stay behind alone. He became seriously ill with fever and nearly died. Everything became personally dark for him too, as he found himself entering into a state of personnel turmoil and self-recrimination. He began to see "more and more my utter hollowness". Yet at the same time he felt the love of God. This turmoil lasted weeks until he was well enough to make his way back to England. It was then he wrote the poem "The Pillar of the Cloud", which later became known the hymn, "Lead, Kindly Light". Let us reflect on these beautiful words:

# "The Pillar of the Cloud"

Lead, Kindly Light, amid the encircling gloom,
Lead Thou me on!
The night is dark, and I am far from home,-Lead Thou me on!
Keep Thou my feet; I do not ask to see
The distant scene,--one step enough for me.

I was not ever thus, nor prayed that Thou Shouldst lead me on:

I loved to choose and see my path, but now Lead Thou me on!

I loved the garish days, and, spite of fears, Pride ruled my will: remember not past years.

So long Thy power hath blest me, sure it still Will lead me on;

O'er moor and fen, o'er crag and torrent, till The night is gone;

And with the morn those angel faces smile Which I have loved long since, and lost awhile.
